Overview: Prenatal exposure to alcohol and other drugs is the leading cause of preventable birth defects in the country. Despite warnings from experts and volumes of scientific/medical research providing compelling evidence for mothers not to drink during pregnancy, one in 100 babies born in Ohio suffer from Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) – a wide range of permanent, life-altering physical, mental and social effects.

The Ohio Departments of Aging, Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services, Education, Health, Job and Family Services, Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities, Rehabilitation and Correction, and Youth Services are working together with Ohio Family and Children First, institutes of higher education, providers and parents to implement a statewide strategic plan to address FASD.
